

2016 was a year of exploration and education in impact investment:

- Creating a high-quality advisory committee

2017 is the year for implementation:

- \$20 million allocated in private equity or private debt
- Creation of a regular education process for family and advisors
- Visits with fund managers and portfolio companies
- \$2 million allocated in grant support for cutting-edge policy and research


- With opportunity, consequence, mentorship and access

TOOLS: Innovations in Learning

- Investing in the policies, ideas, and practices that are shaping and informing new models of learning
- Approaching our work through a profound respect for the diversity of learning styles and the diversity of human intelligence
- ✓ Maintaining a particular focus on learning strategies that use *maker* and project-inquiry approaches
- ✓ Early example:
 - Investments in ten schools that demonstrated achievement with low income students
- Holding site visits where we learned from the leaders, students, and teachers in the schools
- Bringing the school leaders together to discuss key issues in learning

- Major grant to to organize public lectures from the best innovators in learning and conduct national research on *maker* education
- Major grant to rethink high school curriculum and learning strategies as well as the role of a private high school
- Identifying and supporting practitioners who are demonstrating results using the best active learning strategies
- Extracting the learning from grantees and practitioners to build the long term TOOLS strategy

Implementation of Puppy Mill Strategy:

- National focus on policy and building data infrastructure to measure results
- Local focus (Florida and Pennsylvania) on local ordinances, state-wide regulations and enforcement, higher quality shelters, and scale solutions to spay-neuter needs
- Friends to Animals plays a national and local convening role
- ✓ Staffing for Friends to Animals

Planning and Research for second phase of Friends to Animals:

- Focus on industrial agriculture and husbandry with particular emphasis on animal cruelty
- Identify opportunities to link animal welfare and environmental tract
